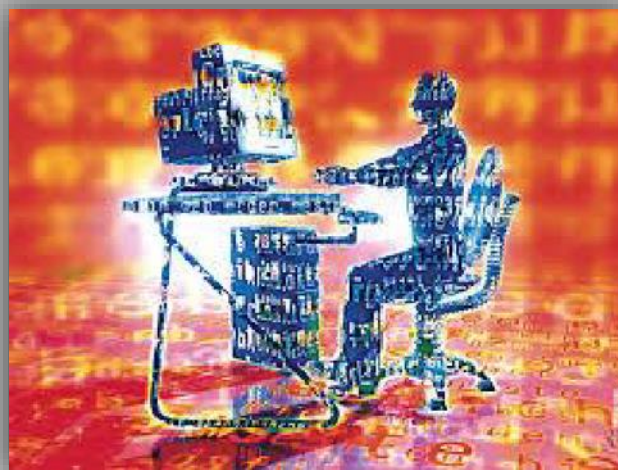

Using the Lessons tool, you can create context with resources, quizzes, assignments, forums, and media (e.g. video, audio, and image) in a central location. Lessons can also be a platform for student created pages and peer review.
